#### CLASS RANK

### SCHOOL DAY AND CREDIT

Students have four (4) 80 minute blocks each semester.

Ten (10) credit courses meet 5 days/week for 80 minutes each day for the entire year.

Five (5) credit courses meet 5 days/week for 80 minutes each day for one semester (18 weeks).

Two and a half  $(2\frac{1}{2})$  credit courses meet 5 days/weeks for 80 minutes each day for 9 weeks.

## **CURRICULUM**

The curriculum is an open, comprehensive curriculum. For graduation, students must earn 130 credits including:

Advanced Placement is offered in English III (Language & Composition), English IV (Literature & Composition), U.S. History, U.S. Government & Politics, Calculus, Biology, Chemistry, Spanish, Music Theory, Art History and European History.

Honors courses are offered in English I-IV, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Human Biology, World History, United States History I and II, Criminal Justice, World Language, Business, Fine Arts, Naval Science, and Technology.

Dual Credit opportunities are available with Camden County College, Rutgers University and Stockton University.

Special Programs in career are offered.

Computer technology is school-wide, and technology is integrated throughout all courses. Sterling is currently a 1:1 school district and each student is outfitted with a computer device to use for educational purposes during the school day and beyond. Additionally, four hundred desktops and networked labs are located throughout the Media Center, Engineering Lab, TV & Radio Studios.

Sterling has its own television and radio studios and offers courses in Television Production, Radio Broadcasting, and Digital Photography. In addition, the Sterling High School Education Access Channel broadcasts to the community.

Sterling students have the opportunity to participate in academic, athletic and cultural activities through numerous organizations and teams.
